The orchards and fields of the Western Colorado Research Center lend themselves to use as an outdoor classroom for hands-on learning in food production, life sciences, healthy eating, and civic service. The WCRC has large fields for vegetable production, a Service Learning Garden for exploring, a shaded "forest" with picnic tables for lunch and playtime, and a classroom for indoor learning. WHAT IS WCRC?

The Western Colorado Research Center (WCRC), located in Orchard Mesa, is a Colorado State University facility where research is conducted on locally grown crops (tree fruit, wine grapes, vegetables). In addition, WCRC is the location of Community Alliance for Education and Hunger Relief program. This program grows fruit and vegetables for food banks, the Lunch Lizard, and the school district, while providing handson learning experiences for students of all ages.
